



HOW TO ASK FOR HELP

Decide what the issue really is.

- What is happening?
- How long have you had this problem?
- Who is it an issue for?

Gather together documents and information.

-Medical Information:

- * doctors and dentists' names and addresses
- * medical records / card
- * immunization records

- Legal Papers

- * birth certificates
- * Social Security cards
- * divorce / custody papers

- Income Verification

- * pay stubs or unemployment statement
- * W-2's or tax form
- * verification from Department of Job and Family Services or the Social Security office

Check the Resource Directory and contact the right agency for help.

- Be clear about what you want.
- Have your documents together.
- Write down the date, who you talked to, and what you are told.
- Repeat the information so you know it is correct.

If the agency cannot help you, ask who can. Be persistent!

You may have to make several contacts and talk to many people.
