KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Do you, or someone you know, have a child that will be entering school this fall as a kindergartner? If so, now is the time to contact the prospective school district to register your child in preparation for the upcoming school year.

Registration for Upper Sandusky school students will be held on April 27th and 28th.

Registration for Carey school students is

scheduled for April 6th and 7th.

Parents must call their child's prospective school district in advance to schedule an appointment for their child for registration day.



Incoming kindergartners are required to be up to date on vaccines prior to school entry.

Parents and guardians may contact their child's health care provider to check a child's immunization status and make an appointment for vaccines, if necessary.

Wyandot County Public Health gives vaccines in both Carey and Upper Sandusky by appointment. Call 419-294-3852 for more info.

INFANT IMMUNIZATION WEEK

National Infant Immunization Week is an annual event that was created to celebrate the achievements of immunization programs worldwide and inform the public of the importance of protecting infants from vaccine-preventable diseases through immunization.

Infant and child immunization saves up to 3 million lives each year globally.

The primary vaccine series for infants begins soon after birth with the introduction of the 1st Hepatitis B vaccine. Babies receiving vaccines "on-time" complete the series at 18 months of age and are protected against 13 vaccine-preventable diseases.

Protection against influenza (a 14th vaccine-preventable disease) can be given to a baby

when it reaches 6 months of age.

Take a moment to check your child's immunization status. Call your healthcare provider for an appointment to update, if behind. Help WCPH keep babies healthy!



PUBLIC HEALTH WEEK

Wyandot County Public Health is celebrating National Public Health Week April 3-9. In reality, WCPH celebrates National Public Health Week year-round as part of a growing movement to create healthier communities within the healthiest nation. WCPH believes in the power of prevention, and actively advocates for healthy and fair policies, sharing strategies and forming and maintaining successful partnerships while championing the role for a strong public health system.

The function of public health surrounds you. WCPH Environmental sanitarians ensure safe private water systems, food service establishments, schools and pools. They monitor vector vector-borne diseases and investigate nuisances throughout the county.

Public health nurses provide protection from vaccine preventable diseases. They are present in the schools to provide education and monitor both healthy and medically fragile students. WCPH nurses also educate parents on safe sleep and travel for their children and provide family planning education and options.

Nutrition education and supplemental food assistance is available at the WIC office located within Wyandot County Public Health. Birth & death records are available at WCPH, too!

The plants will then be transplanted in straw bales and garden boxes.
